 To have and to hold the afore-granted Premises to the said Jose-
 phus Wheaton his Heirs and Assigns, to his and their use and
 behoof forever. And I do, for myself my Heirs, Executors and
 Administrators, covenant with the said Josephus Wheaton his
 Heirs and Assigns, that I am lawfully seized in fee of the afore-
 granted Premises, that they are free of all Incumbrances, that I have
