Know all men by these presents that I Warfield Thresher of Mendon in the County of Worcester and Commonwealth of Massachusetts, yeoman, in consideration of the sum of one thousand dollars paid me by Jason Staples of Uxbridge in the County aforesaid, husbandman, the receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge do hereby give grant bargain sell and convey unto the said Jason Staples his heirs and assigns forever my Marsh farm (so called) with the buildings thereon thereon situate in the north Parish in Mendon containing by estimation forty four acres and eighty seven rods the same more or less bounded as follows to wit, beginning at the southeasterly corner of said premises on westerly side of a town road at corner of wall at Dennis Wheelock's land — thence northerly by and with said road to a heap of stones at land belonging to Adolphus Daniels — thence westerly 23 rods to a heap of stones — thence northerly about 20 rods — thence westerly to a large rock with stones on it at George Staples' land and bounded northwesterly land formerly owned by Elijah Thoward deceased — thence southerly by said Staples' land about 20 rods to a
