I now all men by these presents that I Robert Allen of Mendon
in the County of Worcester & Commonwealth of Massachusetts, yeoman,
in consideration of fifteen hundred dollars paid by William Buck of
Medway in the County of Norfolk, manufacturer, the receipt whereof I do
hereby acknowledge do hereby give grant sell and convey unto the said
William Buck his heirs and assigns a certain tract or parcel of land situa-
ted in said Mendon containing by estimation fifty acres be the same more
or less and bounded as follows viz beginning at a heap of stones on the
north side of the Hartford & Dedham turnpike road, being the corner
of land now owned by Timothy Ellis & being his house lot - thence run-
ning easterly bounding southerly on said turnpike road about
seventy five rods to a town road leading to Milford - thence bounding
easterly on said Milford road about ninety six rods to the eight rod
road so called - thence bounding on said eight rod road, about
sixteen rods to the land belonging to the M^r Catharine Smith's heirs
to a heap of stones being the corner bounds - thence West about thirty
three degrees South, one hundred and eight rods to a heap of
stones - thence N. 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ W. ten rods to a heap of stones thence N. 15 \circ
S. 20 rods to a town road leading from where George Aldrich for-
merly lived to said turnpike road - The last three lines are bounded
northerly on said Catharine's heirs' land - thence southerly bounding
on said last mentioned road about fifty five rods to said Timo-
thy Ellis' land - thence bounding on said Timothy's land to the first
bounds - together with all the buildings thereon standing - reserv-
ing a privilege of a way through the premises to convey water ta-
ken from Muddy Brook, so called, and turning the water of said
brook for the purpose of watering the land of Samuel Graskiss as
will more fully appear by deed of one David Metcalf deceased to
