Know all men by these presents, that I Timothy Adams of Needham in the County of Norfolk, in consideration of two thousand dollars paid to me by Seneca Carter of Barre in the County of Worcester, the receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge, do hereby grant, sell and quit-claim unto the said Seneca Carter his heirs and assigns, all my right title, claim and demand, in and unto the following described parcel of real estate with the buildings thereon standing, containing about two acres of land more or less, Situate in said Barre on the Templeton road about thirty rods from the common. Bounded as follows, Beginning at a Stake and Stones on the road West of the house at a corner of John L. Woods land, thence South 49° East about sixteen rods to a Stake and Stones bounded by said Wood, thence North 16° East about 28 1/2 rods to a Stake & Stones it being a corner of George Jenkins land, & bounded on land owned by Lyman E. Sibley & of said Jenkins, thence North 46° West about nine rods & nine links to a Stake & Stones on the road, thence on said road to the place of beginning, about twenty two rods & nineteen links, with all the privileges to the well of water & lead pipes reserved to me on land North of the road & lately Deeded to Samuel Smith Jr.
