Know all men by this presents that I Welcome Farmum of Blackstone in the County of Worcester and Commonwealth of Massachusetts Manufacturer in consideration of four hundred and fifty dollars to me paid by Willens Taft of Mendon in said County the receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge do hereby give grant sell and convey unto the said Willens Taft a certain tract of land situate in said Blackstone on the southerly side of the new and recently constructed from Blackstone village to Moonsocket R.R. bounded as follows viz. commencing on the southerly line of said road at the north easterly corner of James Grants land and running easterly along the southerly line of said road forty five feet to grantors land - thence southerly with grantors land and parallel with the easterly line of said Grants land to the north line of the P. & W. Rail Road - thence westerly bounding southerly by said ^{rail} road to said Grants land - thence
