Sumner Edwin Know all men by these presents that I Edwin Sumner
to of Milford in the County of Worcester and Commonwealth
Alex. E. Barker of Massachusetts in consideration of one thousand six
Stamp \$2.00 hundred dollars to me paid by Alexander E. Barker of
(Cancelled) Newry in the County of Oxford and State of Maine and
Ezra Seland of Holliston in the County of Middlesex and
State of Massachusetts, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowl-
edged do hereby remise release and forever quitclaim
unto the said Alexander E. Barker and Ezra Seland
their heirs and assigns a certain parcel of land with
all the buildings thereon in the following proportions
to wit, to the said Barker his heirs and assigns two
undivided third parts thereof and to the said Seland
his heirs and assigns one undivided third part there-
of. The said parcel of land is situated in the Westerly
part of said Milford, being a part of the property known
as the Deacon Chapin farm and is bounded and described
as follows to wit. Beginning at stones on a rock at the
Westerly side of the premises, at other land of the grantees,
thence N. 80° 30' E. on other land of the grantor sixty rods
more or less to stake and stones at land of R. Cleveland
thence Southerly on land of heirs of Ira Cleveland to land
of Milford Town Poor Farm, thence Westerly on land of said
Town Poor Farm crossing the road to the river, thence on
the river and on land of said Alexander E. Barker and
Ezra Seland to the place of beginning reserving the right
to remove such rock maple trees and spruce trees from
said premises within six months from the date hereof
as said Sumner may choose for transplanting, also one
apple tree to be removed within the six months aforesaid
Also reserving the right to pass and repass over the path
or road across said premises to other land of the grantor
upon condition that the grantor pay one half of the
expense of keeping the same in repair and one half the
expense of erecting and keeping in repair such gates as
may be needed at all fences crossing the same and shall
always close said gates when passing through. It being
