dollar and other valuable considerations paid by Nancy
M. Woods, of said Mendon, the receipt whereof is hereby
acknowledged, do hereby give, grant, bargain, sell and
convey unto the said Nancy M. Woods, A certain
tract or parcel of land with buildings thereon, sit-
uated in the Town of said Mendon aforesaid, near
Mendon Village on the easterly side of the Dam
Swamp Road, so called, containing twelve acres, more
or less, and bounded as follows, viz: Beginning at the
southwesterly corner of the premises at land of or
formerly J. R. Taft; thence easterly on land of said
Taft, 30 rods, more or less, to land of Albert W. Gaskill;
thence northerly on said Gaskill's land 20 rods, more
or less, to a corner; thence westerly on land of Gilbert
Gaskill and land now or formerly of Lucy Darling to
said road; thence southerly on said road 20 rods,
more or less, to the place of beginning: being the
same premises - to me by deed from Elizabeth R.
Gordell, dated Nov. 12th 1892, recorded - Worcester Dis-
trict Deeds, Lib. 1395, Folio 386. To have and to
hold the granted premises, with all the privileges and
appurtenances thereto belonging, to the said Nancy M.
Woods and her heirs and assigns, to their own use and
behoof forever. And I hereby, for myself and my heirs,
executors and administrators, covenant with the grantee
and her heirs and assigns that I am lawfully seized
in fee simple of the granted premises, that they
are free from all incumbrances, that I have good right
to sell and convey the same as aforesaid: and that
I will and my heirs, executors and administrators
shall warrant and defend the same to the grantee
