Book 392 Page 288 — To have and to hold the aforesigned
premises to the said Hastings his heirs and assigns to him and their use
and behoof forever. And I do for myself my heirs executors and
administrators covenant with the said Hastings his heirs and
assigns that I am lawfully seized in fee of the aforesigned premises
that they are free of all incumbrances that I have good right to sell
and convey the same to the said Hastings and that I will warrant
and defend the same promises to the said Hastings his heirs and
assigns forever against the lawful claim and demands of all persons

Provided nevertheless that if the said Albert Gould his heirs
executors or administrators pay to the said Charles C. Hastings
or his executors administrators or assigns the sum of seven
hundred dollars with interest semiannually in two years from the
date hereof then this deed as also a certain note of hand bearing
date with these presents given by the said Albert Gould to the said
Charles C. Hastings to pay the same sum at the time of foresaid
shall be void otherwise shall remain in full force.

In witness whereof the said Albert Gould together with Dolly
B. Gould my wife who joins me in this deed for the purpose
of relinquishing her right of dower in the premises have hereunto
set our hands and seals this ninth day of April in the year of our
Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty five.
