of Worcester and Commonwealth of Massachusetts yeoman in consideration  
of summons Ball of fifty dollars to me paid by Dennismore Ball of Boylston and in County  
and Commonwealth aforesaid, there receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge  
to hereby give grant sell and convey unto the said Dennismore Ball his  
heirs and assigns a certain tract of woodland situated in the Easterly part  
of Boylston containing by estimation three acres and sixty five rods be the  
same more or less. Said woodland is bounded as follows beginning at the  
Southwardly corner at a heap of stones a corner of land belonging to Wm. H.  
Moore and runs thence N. 78 $\frac{1}{2}$  E. sixty two rods by land of Elijah Ball to a  
heap of stones thence N. 20 W. eighteen rods to a pine stub on a ledge of rocks  
a corner of land belonging to Nathaniel Hastings thence a straight line  
by land of Nathaniel Hastings and Wm. H. Moore to the first mentioned  
bound. — To have and to hold the aforesigned premises to the  
said Dennismore Ball to his heirs and assigns to his heirs and bhoaf  
forever and I do for myself my heirs executors and administrators command  
with the said Dennismore Ball and his heirs and assigns that I am lawfully  
seized in fee of the aforesigned premises that they are free of all incum  
brances that I have good right to sell and convey the same to the said  
Dennismore Ball and that I will warrant and defend the same premises  
to the said Dennismore Ball to his heirs and assigns forever against the  
lawful claims and demands of all persons. — In witness whereof I

hands and seals this thirty first day of January in the year of our Lord  
one thousand eight hundred and forty five. —
