Know all men by these presents that I Marcena Daniels of Mendon in the County of Worcester and Commonwealth of Massachusetts yeoman in consideration of the sum of two thousand dollars paid by Christopher Daniels of said Mendon yeoman the receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge do hereby give grant sell and convey unto the said Christopher Daniels his heirs and assigns one undivided half part of the follow^{ing described} pieces of land to wit. First. one undivided half part of a certain piece of land with a dwelling house barn & other out buildings thereon situated in the westerly part of Mendon containing about one hundred and two acres of land more or less and bounded as follows to wit. northerly by land of Minors Mowry, westerly by land of the widow Mowry & John M. Fowler, southerly by land of Thomas Taft and the road leading from Mendon centre to Uxbridge centre and easterly by land of Seth Southwick and the road leading from Seth Southwicks to Minors Mowry with all the privileges and appurtenances thereunto belonging. second one undivided half part of a certain piece of land with a dwelling house and barn thereon, called the Lovell place situated in the southwesterly part of said Mendon containing about sixty acres of land more or less and bounded as follows to wit. northerly by Mellens Taft land and land of John M. Fowler, westerly by land of Wheeler Aldrich, Cuvok Southwicks and land of Ellis Albee, southerly by the road leading from Mellens Taft to Uxbridge and easterly by said last mentioned road with all privileges and appurtenances thereunto belonging. Third. one undivided half part of a certain piece of pasture and woods land situated in the westerly part of said Mendon and called the Fairbanks lot containing twenty seven acres more or less and bounded northerly by land of Lewis Woods, westerly on the road leading from Lewis Woods to Uxbridge and on land of Thomas Taft southerly on land of Thomas Taft, Henry Wheelock and Orrilla Taft, easterly on land of Samuel Taft and the Mendon pond so called with all the privileges and appur-
