


thereof a good and sufficient deed or deeds of conveyance for the same in fee simple and out of the money arising from such sale to retain said sum of two thousand dollars or the part thereof remaining unpaid and also the interest thereon on the same - together with the costs and charges of advertising and selling the same premises - rendering the surplus of the purchase money if anywhere be over and above said sum and interest as aforesaid together with a true and particular account of said sale and charged to the said Joseph R. Wheelock the grantor his heirs executors administrators or assigns - which sale so to be made shall forever be a perpetual bar both in law and equity against the said Joseph R. Wheelock the grantor his heirs and assigns and all other persons claiming or to claim the premises or any part thereof by from or under him them or any of them.


And provided also that until default of or in the payment of the said sum of money or of some part thereof or of the interests therefor or other default contrary to the true intent and meaning of the preceding provisos it shall and may be lawful to and for the said grantor his heirs and assigns peacefully and quietly to hold and enjoy all and singular the premises hereby granted and to receive and take the rents and profits thereof to and for their own use and benefit without the denial or interruption of or by the said grantee or his assigns or of or by any other person or persons claiming from by or under him -
