said Thomas McAbes, his heirs and assigns, the following described premises  
situate in said Mendon, bounded as follows: viz.—Beginning at the corner  
of a fence, at land of Anna N. Hastings, and running south, 22½ east, three  
rods and 18 links—thence south, 24½ east, seven rods, 24½ links, to a corner  
at land of Charles H. Blilde, bounding westerly, by land of said Hastings—  
thence turning and running north 63° east, three rods, 18½ links, to the  
northwest corner of the barn standing on land of said Blilde, and  
bounded southerly, by land of said Blilde—thence turning and running
