

premises, rendering the surplus of the purchase money if any there be over and above said sum and interest as aforesaid, together with a true and particular account of said sale and charges to the said Nancy Sturtevant the grantor her heirs executors administrators or assigns which sale so to be made shall forever be a perpetual bar, both in law and equity, against the said Nancy Sturtevant the grantor her heirs and assigns and all other persons claiming or to claim the premises or any part thereof by from or under her, them, or any of them. And provided also that until default of or in the payment of the said sum of money, or of some part thereof, or of the interest thereof or other default, contrary to the true intent and meaning of the preceding provisos, it shall and may be lawful to and for the said grantor her heirs and assigns peaceably and quietly to hold and enjoy all and singular the premises hereby granted, and to receive and take the rents and profits thereof to and for her own use and benefit, without the denial or interruption of or by the said grantor or his assigns or of or by any other person or persons claiming from by or under him.
