To all people to whom these presents shall come I Stephen Cook of the City and County of Providence in the State of Rhode Island send greeting know ye that I the said Stephen Cook for and in consideration of the sum of thirteen hundred dollars to me in hand before the enclosing hereof well and truly paid by Royal Mellen Wheelock of Mendon in the County of Worcester and State of Massachusetts the receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge and am therewith fully satisfied contented and paid and thereof and of every part and parcel thereof do exonerate acquit and discharge him the said Stephen Cook his heirs executors and administrators forever by these presents have given, granted, bargained, sold, aliened, enfeoffed, conveyed and confirmed, and by these presents do freely fully and absolutely give grant bargain sell alien enfeoff convey and confirm unto him the said Stephen Cook his heirs and assigns forever a certain lot or parcel of land with the buildings and improvements thereon, situated in said Mendon and bounded and described as follows to wit: Bounded westerly by land of Ayman Cook and land of Paul Wheeler, Easterly by land of George Wood and land of Henry Wood, Southerly by the County road running from said Mendon to the neighboring town of Uxbridge, and Westerly by land of Ira W. Cook and land of Louis Stone said lot of land hereby conveyed containing four acres and one hundred seven rods by estimation be the same more or less.
