Containing thirty eight rods more or less. To have and to hold the aforesigned premises to the said Henry W. Wood his heirs and assigns to him & them and behoof forever, And I do for myself my heirs executors and administrators covenant with the said Henry W. Wood his heirs and assigns that I am lawfully seized in fee of the aforesigned premises that they are free of all incumbrance, that I have good right to sell and convey the same to the said Henry W. Wood and that I will warrant and defend the same premises to the said Henry W. Wood his heirs and assigns forever against the lawful claims and demands of all persons.
