 heirs and assigns a certain tract of land with all  
 the buildings thereon situated in Mendon aforesaid  
 upon the southerly side of the county road (formerly  
 the Boston and Hartford Turnpike) a few rods South-  
 easterly of the Unitarian Church containing twenty  
 six rods more or less. and bounded as follows to  
 wit. Beginning at a point upon said road at land  
 belonging to the heirs of Mary M. Hayward late  
 of Mendon. deceased. being the Northwesterly corner  
 of the premises hereby conveyed. thence running  
 Easterly and bounded Northerly by and with said  
 road three rods to a corner. at land formerly Ad-  
 am D. Wheelock's now Alexander H. Allen's. thence
