Know all men by these presents, that I, Hiram Allen, of Webster, in the County of Worcester and Commonwealth of Massachusetts, in consideration of Seven hundred dollars paid by Charles N. Duprey, of said Webster, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, do hereby give, grant, bargain, sell, and convey unto the said Charles N. Duprey, a certain tract or parcel of land situate in said Webster on the South side of Lake street, containing thirty six rods and is bounded and described as follows. Beginning at the Northwest corner of the same which being the Northeast corner of Peter & Ann McGeivins land by said street, thence S. 79° E. by said street sixty three and one third ft. to land of Michael Stanley, thence S. 11° W. by Stanley land one hundred and thirty two ft., thence same course twenty seven ft. more or less, to land of Frank Makuski, thence N. 79° W. by said Franks land to land of said Peter & Ann sixty three and one third feet, thence N. 11° W. by said Peter & Anne land one hundred and fifty nine feet, more or less, to the first named bound, with the buildings thereon standing.
