I know all men by these presents that I, John Hough of Worcester, in the county of Worcester and Commonwealth of Massachusetts, in consideration of One Dollar and other valuable considerations had by Abbie L. Sweetser of said Worcester, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, do hereby give, grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said Abbie L. Sweetser a certain tract of land situated on the Northerly side of Randall street, a new street forty (40) feet wide extending Easterly through my estate from West Boylston street in said Worcester, and bounded and described as follows, to wit: Beginning at a stone bound on the Northerly line of said Randall street, one hundred and twenty (120) feet Easterly from West Boylston street; thence Northerly by land this day conveyed by me to Robert C. Sweetser one hundred and twenty (120) feet to a stone bound at land of the grantor; thence Easterly by said land of the grantor sixty (60) feet to a stone bound at other land conveyed as aforesaid to said Robert C. Sweetser; thence Southerly by said Robert C. Sweetser's land one hundred and twenty (120) feet to a stone bound on said line of Randall street; thence Westerly by said line of Randall street sixty (60) feet to the place of beginning. Reserving however to the grantor and his heirs and assigns the right to maintain the aqueduct or water pipe now in said tract and the right to enter upon said tract at all times to make repairs upon said pipe or aqueduct.
