Briggs

that I, Rufus E. Briggs of Mendon in the County of Worcester and Commonwealth of Massachusetts,

to

in consideration of One Dollar and other valuable considerations paid by Julia A. Briggs of said Mendon

the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, do hereby give, grant, bargain, sell, and convey unto the said Julia A. Briggs two undivided third parts of a certain tract or parcel of land situated in said MENDON with the buildings thereon and bounded as follows, viz: Northerly by the road leading from Milford to Uxbridge and here called Hastings Street; easterly by land formerly of Rebecca L. Holmes and land formerly of one Childs; southerly by land formerly of Sumner Ballou and westerly by land of George M. Taft; reserving to myself a life estate in the granted premises. Being the same premises conveyed to me by deed of Anna A. Hastings dated Feb. 8, 1887 and recorded with Worcester District Deeds, Book 1230, Page 617.

To have and to hold the granted premises, with all the privileges and appurtenances thereto belonging, to the said Julia A. Briggs and her heirs and assigns, to their own use and behoof forever.

And I do hereby for myself and my heirs, executors, and administrators, covenant with the said grantee and her heirs and assigns that I am lawfully seized in fee-simple of the granted premises, that they are free from all incumbrances except said reservation;

that I have good right to sell and convey the same as aforesaid; and that I will and my heirs, executors, and administrators shall warrant and defend the same to the said grantee and her heirs and assigns forever against the lawful claims and demands of all persons, except as aforesaid.
