with quietus tennants,

the land in said Mendon, with the buildings thereon, situated on the
northwesterly side of Blackstone Street, being bounded and de-
scribed as follows, to wit:-Beginning at a cement bound at the
southeasterly corner of the granted premises at other land of the
grantor; thence N. 43° 30' E. Three Hundred Fifteen(315) feet to
cement bound at the southwesterly side of a right of way of one
Barrows; thence northwesterly along the southwesterly side of
said right of way Seventy-Two and 5/10 (72.5) feet to a cement
bound at land of said Barrows; thence southwesterly along land
of said Barrows and with a stone wall Two Hundred Sixty (260) feet
to an angle or bend in said stone wall; thence continuing with
said stone wall southwesterly One Hundred Twenty (120) feet to a
cement bound at other land of the grantor; thence S. 46° 30' E.
along other land of the grantor Two Hundred Twenty(220) feet to
the place of beginning. The first description above mentioned
being along the northwesterly side of said Blackstone Street.

The said premises being conveyed subject to water rights
mentioned in deed from Harry C. Gaskill to Edward H. Taft,
recorded in Worcester District Deeds, Book 1395, Page 403; and
also subject to any rights of the American Telephone & Telegraph
Company or the New England Telephone & Telegraph Company to con-
struct, operate and maintain its lines over the granted premises,
if any such rights exist.

The grantees and their heirs and assigns shall have the right
in common with the grantor and his heirs and assigns to draw water
from a well on the premises of Phineas A. and Bertha D. Millis;
with the right to enter the premises of the said Millis and the
premises of the grantor, for the purpose of repairing, maintaining
