I, Bennette H. Williams, of Mendon, Worcester County, Massachusetts, being of sound mind makes this my last Will and Testament.

To my oldest daughter, Marytie Williams I give the old family Bible which was my father's also all my clothing, and a dozen silver tea spoons bought by my mother just before her death and marked "Bennette".

To my oldest son, Hill Williams I give an article of furniture known as the "old red desk" which my father always used and which my grandfather had made, also a pair of silver bowed spectacles with some other little articles all of which were my father's and which are contained in a little draw said desk.

I wish my second son, Beaton Williams to have my gold watch and chain the watch having been bought one by my father when I first went away to school.

I leave my third son, Wendel Williams the gold bowed spectacles which were my mother's.

To my fourth son, Eben Williams I give two decent spoons and one silver tea spoon, the former marked with the name Eliza Abbot, the latter marked E. P.

To my second daughter, Lissa Williams I give all my jewelry save that already disposed of and my finger rings which I leave to my youngest child, Ethel Williams.

To my fifth son, Paul Williams I bequeath a tract of land situate in the town of Blackstone on Waterbury Hill so called, said piece of land was formerly a part of the estate of my grandfather, Daniel Hill and I hope that my son will choose out to part with it during his life and that it will remain in the family after his death.

To my husband, Gustavus B. Williams I give all articles of personal property belonging to me on or about the premises where we now live except those hereinbefore disposed of to be his absolutely notes, bonds and other claims against other persons excepted.

I also give to my said husband all the property real and personal, not hereinbefore disposed of, which I may die seized and possessed, to be held by him separate from his own in trust and he is hereby fully authorized to sell at public or private sale and make good conveyance of the same or any part thereof and receive the same, managing the whole as if it were his own and using

the income and such of the principal as may be needed in the rearing and educating our six younger children and when the youngest shall come of age dividing what remains among our children as in his judgment their several necessities require.

The special trust in favor of our six younger children is created because the two older are already provided for by the will of my late father, Dan Hill.

I nominate and appoint my husband, Gustavus B. Williams sole executor of this will and request that he be not required to give any surety or sureties on his official bond or bonds as executor or trustee under this will.
