Being sick and weak of body, but of sound and disposing mind, memory and understanding, considering the certainty of death, and the uncertainty of the time thereof, do make publish and declare this as and for my last Will and Testament, revoking all former wills by me made.

And my Will is first that after my decease my body shall be decently buried, and that my just debts and funeral charges shall be paid by my Executors hereinafter named. And as to the residue of my estate and property with which God has blessed me and which shall not be required for the payment of my just debts, funeral charges and the expences in and about the execution of this my Will and the administration of my estate, I give, devise and dispose of, to wit, I give and devise to my beloved Sister Eunice French, all the residue of my estate, both real, personal & mixed, which I shall be seized and possessed, or to which I shall be entitled at the time of my decease, to have and to hold the same, to her and to her heirs, Executors, Administrators and assigns to her and their use and behoof forever.

For my brother John French, and my sister Achsa Thomson, and my sister Amy French (alias Haywards) together with said children (viz. Hanson Thomson, Horace Thomson, Charles Thomson and Emily Thomson, of my late sister Polly Thomsons wife of George Thomson, I make no provision in this my last Will and Testament, for the reason that my estate is small and believing that my sister Eunice is best entitled to my estate.

Lastly, I do nominate & appoint Joseph B. Chapin of Upton Executor of this my last Will and Testament. In testimony whereof I the said Sarah French have to this my last Will and Testament, contained on this one sheet of Paper subscribed my name and affixed my seal this eighth day of August A. D. one thousand eight hundred and thirty eight.
