Whealock Simon. I know all men by these presents that I Simon Whealock of Mendon  
in the County of Worcester and Commonwealth of Massachusetts yeoman  
have sold to the said George W. Robinson in consideration of fifteen hundred dollars to me paid by the said George W. Robinson  
of me the receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge do hereby give grant sell and convey unto the said George W. Robinson his heirs and assigns for certain tracts or parcels of land  
within the apprentices situated in said Mendon. The first of said tracts  
of land with a dwelling house barn and other buildings thereon contains  
about twenty three acres better or worse or less and is bounded as  
follows to wit beginning at a corner of the wall on the East side of the  
road leading from the North Parish in said Mendon to the South  
Parish meetinghouse in said town at a corner of land of the heirs of  
Lever Albee being the Northwest corner of the premises thence running  
by and with said road Southwesterly till it comes to the road which  
leads by the house owned by Nathan Fletcher there by and with said  
last mentioned road till it comes to land occupied by Leaman Green  
and owned by the heirs of the late Elijah Hayward deceased thence North  
about fifteen rods to land owned by Moses T. Chapin and  
bounding Easterly on land of said last mentioned heirs thence North-  
westerly about seven rods to land of Abram Taft and bounding on  
said Chapin thence West 45° North until it comes to land of the heirs  
of Lever Albee and bounding on said Abram Taft thence Southwesterly  
about twenty six rods to a stake and stones thence Westerly as the fence
