

of the wall and a corner of ²²⁴Elijah Taft's land on the Northerly side of the road leading from the brick school house in the seventh school district in said town to and by Davoille Taft's dwelling house being the South-west corner of said tract thence North $9\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ West with the wall as it now stands and with land of said Elijah Taft till it comes to land of Moses Taft thence with the wall an ditch on land of said Moses till it comes to land of the heirs of Nathan Wheelock deceased then Northeasterly as the wall now stands to land of Swan Taft & bounding on said last mentioned heirs then East $28\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ South thirty nine rods to the first mentioned road leading to the South Parish meeting house and bounding Northerly on Swan Taft's land thence on the last mentioned road running Southerly till it comes to land of Enos Abce then turning and running Westerly with said Abce's land then turning and running Southerly with said Abce's land then turning and running Easterly with said Abce's land to said last mentioned road then running by and with the road leading past said Schoolhouse to Davoille Taft's to the first mentioned bound reserving and excepting the right of said School district to keep and maintain said school house thereon where it now stands so long as it shall be used and occupied for that purpose. — The third of said tracts of land is situated in the central part of said Mendon containing about ten acres be the same more or less and is bounded as follows to wit: beginning at a corner of a wall a little Easterly of dam swamp bridge so called on the Northerly side of an old road thence Northerly as the wall now stands and bounding by and with said old road about sixty three rods to a corner in said wall thence Westerly by and with said wall about twenty one and an half rods to stones on a high rock thence West about 14° South about twenty and an half rods to stones on a white oak stump at land of the heirs of Seth Southwick deceased the two last lines bounding on land recently owned by Ebenezer Taft thence South about $6\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ East about seventeen rods to stones on a ledge of rocks thence South $8\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ West twenty rods to the end of an old wall the two last lines bounding Westerly on the heirs of the said Southwick thence Southerly by and with an old wall about six rods to a heap of stones on a flat rock under said wall thence Westerly a direct line to stones on a rock on the Westerly side of a brook thence down stream of said brook two rods to stones on the Easterly side of said brook thence Easterly until it comes to the last mentioned wall two rods Southerly of stones on a flat rock under said wall thence Southerly by and with said wall about eight rods to the first mentioned bound the five last lines bounding on land now or recently owned by the said Ebenezer Taft this being the same tract of land which Elijah Prayer Esquire conveyed to me by his deed dated the first day of December A.D. 1832. — The fourth
