to of Cheshire, and State of New Hampshire, yeoman, in consideration of five hundred
Dennis Coomes. and twenty five dollars, paid by Dennis Coomes, of Mendon, in the County of
Worcester, and Commonwealth of Massachusetts, Boat-maker, the receipt
whereof I do hereby acknowledge, do give, grant, sell, and convey unto the
said Dennis Coomes, his heirs and assigns, the following described piece or parcel
of land, situated in said Mendon, and bounded as follows, to wit: Beginning
at the Northwesterly corner at the Northeasterly corner of land belonging to
Mrs. Mary M. Hayward, or the heirs of Caleb Hayward, late of Mendon, de-
ceased; thence running Southerly, bounding Westerly by land of Mrs. Hayward,
or said heirs to a corner at the wall, and at land belonging to the heirs of
Seth Hastings, deceased; thence turning Easterly, bounding Southerly, by land
of said heirs as the wall now stands, to a corner, at land of Alvan T. Staples;
thence turning Northerly, bounding Easterly by land of said Staples to a
spike driven into the top of a post on the Southerly side of the Old Hartford
Turnpike, so called; thence turning Westerly, bounding Northerly, by the Southerly
side line of said old Hartford turnpike to the first mentioned corner. The
first described line runs by and with the centre of the ditch, containing one
