

thereon on the opposite side of said road from the dwelling house on said first described tract, containing one half acre more or less and described in said deed of Rufus Harris to said Albee.

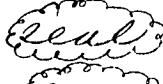

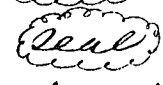

Know all men by these presents that I Rufus Harris of Mendon in the County of Worcester and Commonwealth of Massachusetts in consideration of thirty five hundred Dollars to me paid by Holland Albee of said Mendon, the receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge, do hereby give, grant, sell, and convey, unto the said Holland Albee his heirs and assigns, a certain tract of land with the buildings thereon situate in the Northerly part of said Mendon, on Misco Hill, so called, on the southwesterly side of the road leading from Mendon to Northbridge, containing eighty acres more or less, called the Gop farm and bounded as follows to wit:- Beginning at a point on said road, being the North easterly corner of the premises, and a corner of the land of David Davenport; thence running south 16° West 13 rods & 10 links by a wall to a corner of said wall
