Chase to Willard Holbrook, dated May 17, 1899 and recorded in the Registry of Deeds for the County of Worcester, Lib. 1620, Folio 52 will be sold at public auction, on the premises, on Friday the twentieth day of July 1900, at two o'clock in the afternoon, all and singular the premises conveyed by said mortgage deed, namely: Three certain tracts of land with the buildings thereon, situated in the Southernly part of Wendon, in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, on the road leading from Albertville, so-called, to Chestnut Hill so called, the first tract being situated on Easternly side of said road, contains 35 acres more or less, and is bounded and described as follows, namely: Beginning at the Southwesterly corner of the premises on the above described road at land formerly of the heirs of Arnold Craft; thence Easterly on said heirs land about 46 acres thence Southernly on said heirs land about 24 rods to land of the heirs of Willis Southwick; thence Northeasterly on land of said Southwick and land now or formerly of the heirs of Abel Aldrich about 60 rods to the Little Pond, so-called; thence on said Pond and land formerly of Jase Staples, Northernly to a swamp formerly of Edward C. Staples thence Westernly bounded Northernly on said Staples to a stake; thence Northernly bounded Easterly on said Staples to land formerly of Aram Staples; thence Westernly bounded Northernly on said Staples land to said road; thence Southernly on said road to the place of beginning.
