Thence on said Williams' land, S. 80° E., twenty (20) rods; -

Thence S. 79 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° E., eighteen (18) rods and eighteen (18) links; -

Thence S. 20° W., five (5) rods and ten (10) links; -

Thence south twenty-three (23) rods to land now or formerly of Willis Southwick; -

Thence on said Southwick land, S. 35° W., twenty-five (25) rods and eighteen (18) links; -

Thence S. 89° E., nine (9) rods and twenty (20) links; -

Thence S. 1° W., twenty-five (25) rods and twenty (20) links; -

Thence S. 48 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° W., eight (8) rods and eleven (11) links; -

Thence S. 67° W., sixteen (16) rods; -

Thence S. 78 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° W., six (6) rods and ten (10) links; -

Thence S. 2° E., one (1) rod and $\frac{1}{16}$ /(16) links to a rock at corner of land formerly of Edward S. Staples; -

Thence on said Staples land S. 74° W. ten (10) rods and five (5) links to stake and stones; -

Thence S. 77 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° W., seven (7) rods and twenty-three (23) links to stake and stones; -

Thence S. 49° W., twelve (12) rods and twenty (20) links to stake and stones at land now or formerly of Thompson Taft; -

Thence on said Taft land, N. 50 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° W., thirty-two (32) rods and ten (10) links to land formerly of Abah Esty;

Thence northwesterly about one hundred ninety-six (196) rods on said Esty land and land formerly of Mary and Olive Hayward to land of Andrew Southwick; -
