Know all men by these presents that I Peter Thompson of Mendon in the County of Worcester & Commonwealth of Massachusetts (Gentleman) in consideration of the sum of two thousand two hundred Dollars paid me by Henry Seawing of Mendon in the County of Worcester and Commonwealth of Massachusetts ^{of a former} acquire the receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge do hereby give grant sell and convey unto the said Henry Seawing his heirs and assigns four several pieces of land lying in Mendon aforesaid the first piece containing about fifty acres and is bounded as follows (viz) beginning at the South west corner of the Ballard Lot (so called) now improved by Benjⁿ Davenport on the Easterly side of the County road leading to Worcester thence running Northwesterly with a wall and said Ballard Lot so called about one hundred and forty eight rods to a heap of stones in the center of muddy Brook (so called) then turning and running Southwesterly with said Brook down stream till it comes to land formerly owned by Stephen Torrey late of Mendon enclosed to a heap of stones being the Southeast corner of the Dorr farm (so called) thence turning and running Southwesterly by said Torrey, land and with a wall to the County road aforesaid to a heap of stones thence Northwesterly by said road to the first bound mentioned together with all the buildings thereon standing — The second piece lying on the Southwesterly side of said road containing about ten acres is bounded as follows (viz) beginning at the Easterly corner of Joseph Adams' land at a
