Know all men by these presents that I Henry Sweeting of Mendon in the County of Worcester & Commonwealth of Massachusetts Enquire in consideration of the sum of Two thousand two hundred dollars paid me by Benjamin Davenport of said Mendon in the County of Worcester & Commonwealth of said Massachusetts the receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge do hereby give grant sell and convey unto the said Benjamin Davenport his heirs and assigns four several pieces of land lying in Mendon aforesaid the first piece containing about fifty acres & is bounded as follows (viz) beginning at the Southwest corner of the Ballard lot so called now owned by the said Benjamin on the Easterly side of the County road leading to Worcester thence running Northwesterly with a wall and said Ballard lot so called about one hundred and forty eight rods to a heap of stones in the center of muddy brook so called then turning and running Southwily with said brook downstream till it comes to land formerly owned by Stephen Dorr late of Mendon deceased to a heap of stones being the South East corner of the Dorr farm so called thence turning
