

and running Southwesterly by said Torrey's land and with a fence and wall to the County road aforesaid to a heap of stones thence Northwesterly by said road to the first bound mentioned together with all the buildings thereon standing reserving to myself my heirs and assigns forever a way through the Easterly part of said farm where I have dug a canal to convey water to my home farm with liberty to go on to said farm to repair said canal whenever I myself my heirs or assigns may please and furthermore I reserve to myself my heirs & assigns forever liberty to turn all the water running in said muddy brook into said canal with all the privileges which may in any way appertain to the said water privilege the said Davenport to have the privilege of water for his cattle and no more —

The second piece lying on the Southwesterly side of said County road containing about two acres is bounded as follows (viz) beginning at the Easterly corner of Joseph Adams land at a heap of stones thence running Southwesterly by said Adams land and with a wall to Abigail Puffell's land being a heap of stones thence turning and running Southwesterly by said Puffell's land & land of Enos Taft to a heap of stones being the Westerly corner of Stephen Torrey's land (Deceased) thence Northwesterly by a wall and said Torrey's land to the County road aforesaid being a heap of stones thence Northwesterly by said County road to the first bound —

The third piece ^{of pasture} containing about twenty five acres being wood land is bounded as follows (viz) beginning at a heap of stones at the Northwesterly corner of Stephen Wood's land thence running Westerly as the wall now stands by the road leading from Mendon to Northbridge to a heap of stones at the Northeast corner of Naaman Aldrich's land thence Southwesterly and bounding Westerly on said Aldrich's land to a stake and stones being a corner of Enos Taft's land thence Easterly with a straight line by said Taft's land to a heap of stones by a small black birch tree at the edge of a swamp being a corner of Grindal Wood's land thence North one acre & that sixty six rod & three fourths of a rod to the first ^{bound} mentioned bounding Easterly partly on land of said Grindal and partly on land of said Stephen Wood reserving liberty for Enos Taft his heirs and assigns to pass and repass to his wood lot —

The fourth piece lying in the pine swamps so called containing four acres and one hundred & thirty
