Know all men by these presents that I Horace S. Aldrich of Mendon in the County of Worcester, and Commonwealth of Massachusetts, in consideration of Five Hundred Dollars paid by Julius A. George of said Mendon, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, do hereby give, grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said Julius A. George, a certain tract or parcel of land situated in said Mendon, on the Westerly side of the road leading from Mendon to Upton containing ten acres, more or less and bounded and described as follows viz: Beginning at a large stone at the corner of a wall at the Southeasterly corner of land supposed of one Spofford, thence in a West southwesterly direction with a wall, and bounding on said Spofford land about 40 rods to a corner of wall at land of David W. Bennett; thence South-easterly with a wall and bounding on said Bennett's land 43 rods and 14 links to corner of a wall at said Bennett's land; thence Northeasterly with a wall, and bounding on said Bennett's
