that I, Olivine Paris, otherwise called Albina Paris, of Worcester, Worcester County, Massachusetts, being unmarried for consideration paid, grant to the Worcester County Institution for Savings, a corporation duly established under the laws of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts and located at Worcester, Worcester County, Massachusetts, with M O R T G A G E covenants, to secure the payment of Eighteen Hundred (\$1800.) Dollars on demand with five and one-half (5 1/2) per centum interest per annum payable semi-annually as provided in a note of even date, and also to secure the performance of all agreements herein contained, a certain parcel of land, with the buildings thereon and all the privileges and appurtenances thereto belonging: situated in said City of WORCESTER on the southeasterly side of Douglas Street bounded and described as follows:- Beginning at the most northerly corner thereof at a point in the southeasterly line of said street, at a corner of the lot numbered 15 on a plan of lots recorded in the Worcester District Registry of Deeds, Book 731, Page 653, and running southeasterly by said lot No. 15 by land now or formerly of one Labelle one hundred (100) feet; thence southwesterly by the lots numbered 19 and 20 on said plan forty-five (45) feet; thence northwesterly to said line of Douglas Street; thence northeasterly by said street line thirty-five (35) feet to the point of beginning. Saucier and Emelia A. Saucier, husband and wife, both of Sharon in the State of New Hampshire, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, do hereby G I V E, G R A N T, B A R G A I N, S E L L and C O N V E Y unto the said Joseph R. Saucier and Emelia A. Saucier, two certain parcels of land including all buildings thereon, in said MENDON, being all the same premises conveyed by John H. Cunningham to Robert P. Neil and Annie Neil, by deed dated May 22, 1916, recorded with Worcester District Deeds, Book 2104, Page 587, and bounded and described in said deed as follows, to wit:-
