

William Torrey deed dated October 22^d 1806 recorded in Worcester Registry of Deeds Book 166 Page 14 to said Sweeting. Also the same right deeded to said Sweeting by deed dated November 10th 1806 recorded in Worcester Registry of Deeds Book 167 Page 205. Meaning to convey the right of turning the water as described in the last mentioned deeds.

To have and to hold the above granted premises with all the privileges and appurtenances thereto belonging to the said Amariah A. Taft his heirs and assigns to his or their use and behoof forever. And I the said Samuel W. Doggett for myself and my heirs executors and administrators do covenant with the said Amariah A. Taft his heirs and assigns, that I am lawfully seized in fee simple of the aforegranted premises that they are free from all incumbrances, except one mortgage from said Doggett to the Savings Bank Worcester for one thousand dollars and interest since May 14th 1864. that I have good right to sell and convey the same to the said Amariah A. Taft his heirs and assigns forever as aforesaid and that I will and my heirs executors and administrators shall warrant and defend the same to the said Amariah A. Taft his heirs and assigns forever against the lawful claims and demands of all persons except said Bank.

In witness whereof we the said Samuel W. Doggett and Harriet W. Doggett wife of the said Samuel W. in token of her release of all right and title of or to both dower and homestead in the granted premises have hereunto set our hands and seals this eleventh day of July in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and sixty four.
