Know all men by these presents, that I
Eli Bates of Mendon in the County of Worcester
and Commonwealth of Massachusetts, in consideration of
five thousand dollars paid by Alongs Hall of Seconk in
the County of Bristol and the Commonwealth of Massachu-
setts, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, do hereby
give, grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said Along-
go Hall and his heirs and assigns forever, a certain
tract of land, with the buildings thereon, situated on the
Easterly side of the road leading from said Mendon to
Upton, bounded as follows: Commencing at the South-
westerly corner of said premises at Post lane (so called),
thence Easterly as the wall and fence now stands to a
corner of wall and fence near Muddy Brook, thence turn-
ing and running Northerly as the fence and wall now
stands, bounding Easterly by land of C. C. P. Hastings
heirs to other land of Grantors, thence Northwesterly as the
fence now stands to a wall at land of Stephen Torrey,
thence Northwesterly as the wall and fence now stands
bounding Northerly by said Torrey's land to said road,
thence Southerly bounding Westerly by said road to the
place of beginning. Also eight acres of wood and sprout
land at the Southeasterly corner of the above described prem-
ises, bounded on the South by the said Hastings heirs land,
on the East by other wood land belonging to Amariah A.
Taft, on the North by said Torrey's land, on the West by the
