Beginning at the corner of the wall at the County road leading from said Milford to Upton on the Easterly side of the lane leading from said road to said dwelling house, thence Southeasterly bounding on said road till it comes to land formerly of Theron Holbrook thence Northernly bounding Easterly by land of said Holbrook to land of the heirs of Ira Cleveland thence Westerly bounding Northernly by said Cleveland land till it comes to the old road leading from Milford Poor house to said County road, thence Southernly on said old road till it comes to said County road, thence Easterly on said County road to the place of beginning, containing one hundred acres more or less, with the same reservations and conditions as in deed from John S.
