QUITCLAIM DEED

The Roman Catholic Bishop of Worcester, a corporation sole, organized and operating pursuant to Chapter 197 of the Massachusetts Acts of 1950 and having a usual place of business at 49 Elm Street, Worcester, Worcester County, Massachusetts 01609, for consideration paid and in full consideration of Three Hundred Sixty Thousand Dollars (\$360,000.00), grants to the Town of Mendon, a Massachusetts municipality with offices at 20 Main Street, Mendon, MA 01756, with quitclaim covenants:

The premises located at and known as 29-31 North Avenue, Mendon, Worcester County, Massachusetts 01756, believed to consist of approximately 2.81 acres and being more particularly described as follows, together with all rights appurtenant thereto and all buildings and structures located thereon:

Beginning at the northwest corner of land of Gertrude Jones;

Thence along North Avenue N. 22° 30' W. two hundred fifty-one (251) feet to a stake at the corner of land belonging to one Allie Werber;

Thence N. 67° 46' E. four hundred ninety-seven and 48/100 (497.48) feet along land of Allie Werber to a stake in the center of stone wall at land of one Svendine;

Thence S. 28° 56' E. two hundred twenty-nine and 25/100 (229.25) feet along center of stone wall along land of Svendine to a drill hole in center of wall at land of one Gertrude Jones;

Thence S. 65° 04' W. five hundred twenty-three and 50/100 (523.50) feet along land of Gertrude Jones to the place of beginning.

Containing one hundred twenty-two thousand five hundred eighty-four (122,584) feet more or less.



At a Special Town Meeting held on June 26, 2012 the voters of Mendon took the following action:

ARTICLE 19

Voted to transfer \$2,500 from State Aid Reserve Account and \$2,500 from Finance Committee Reserve for General Expenses, (line item 131C), to be used as a deposit for an option agreement under which Town shall acquire the exclusive option to purchase the St. Michaels' Church property on North Avenue from the Roman Catholic Bishop of Worcester for \$360,000, which option may be exercised by the Town provided that funds for the purchase are duly appropriated at a future town meeting and thereafter approved by a debt exclusion referendum; and the Selectmen are authorized on behalf of the Town to enter into such option agreement upon such other terms and conditions that they deem to be appropriate.

At a Special Town Meeting held on Sept. 25, 2012 the voters of Mendon took the following actions:

ARTICLE 4

Voted that the town appropriate and borrow the sum of Three Hundred Sixty Thousand Dollars (\$360,000) for the purpose of purchasing the property known as St. Michael's Church at 29-31 North Ave., Mendon, MA, Parcel ID# 8-189-29-31 and authorize the Treasurer under the direction of the Board of Selectmen, to issue any bonds or notes that may be necessary for that purpose, as authorized by General Laws Chapter 44, Section 7(3a), or any other general or special law, for a period not to exceed 20 years, provided however, that this appropriation and debt authorization shall be contingent upon passage of a Proposition 2 1/2 debt exclusion referendum question under General Laws Chapter 59, § 21C(k). This article did not get a favorable recommendation from the Finance Committee.
