Morey to David L. Saunders, dated the fifth day of July A. D. 1862 and recorded in the Registry of Deeds in and for the County of Worcester Book 653 Page 559 to which deed and the record thereof, reference is hereby had for any description thereof and the boundaries thereof, meaning and intending hereby to convey all that was conveyed by said deed from Morey to Saunders.

To have and to hold the above granted premises with all the privileges and appurtenances thereto belonging to the said — heirs and assigns, to — use and behoof forever.
