I know all men by these presents, that we, Liberty Goss, in right of his wife and Susan R. Goss, wife of the said Liberty Goss, in her own right, George Davenport, Boot-maker, and Charles Davenport, Seaman, all of Mendon, in the County of Worcester, and Commonwealth of Massachusetts, in consideration of one dollar paid us by Charles A. Davenport, of said Mendon in said County and Commonwealth, yeoman, the receipt whereof we do hereby acknowledge, do hereby grant, sell, and quit-claim unto the said Charles A. Davenport, his heirs and assigns, all our right, title, claim, and demand, in and unto the following described piece or parcel of Cranberry Meadow, situate in said Mendon, and bounded as follows, viz: Beginning at the Northeast-erly corner at the Southeasterly corner of Henry Goss' land; thence running Westerly and bounding Northerly by said Goss' land to land of George Wood; thence turning and running Southerly and bounding Westerly by said Wood's land to land of Ued Thayer; thence turning and running Easterly and bounding Southerly by said Thayer's land to a corner at the Southwesterly corner of the James Lovett place, so called; thence turning and running Northerly and bounding Easterly by the said James Lovett place to the first mentioned corner; containing three acres, more or less; and is the same piece of meadow which Letti Davenport, late of Mendon, deceased, bought of Enos Goss. To have and to hold the same to the said Charles A. Davenport, his heirs and assigns, to his and their use and behoof
