Whereas I Stephen Torrey of Mendon in the County of Worcester and Commonwealth of Massachusetts, Administrator of the Estate of Warren Warren late of Mendon in said County deceased, intestate by order of Thomas Whinnicut Judge of Probate for said County of Worcester at a Probate Court holden at Worcester in and for said County on the seventh day of July A.
