hereby acknowledged, do hereby give, grant, bargain,
sell and convey unto the said Newgent his heirs &
assigns my home farm situate in said Mondon
on both sides of the road leading past the dwelling
house of Francis C. Whelock and bounded
as follows. The part of said farm on the easterly
side of said road is bounded southerly by land of
