And I the said grantor, for myself and my heirs, executors and administrators, do covenant with the said grantee, and his heirs and assigns, that I am lawfully seized in fee simple of the afore-granted premises; that they are free from all incumbrances; that I have good right to sell and convey the same to the said grantee and his heirs and assigns forever as aforesaid; and that I will and my heirs, executors and administrators shall warrant and defend the same to the said grantee and his heirs and assigns forever, against the lawful claims and demands of all persons.
