Birds Thomas

 John Burley

Know all men by these presents that I Thomas  
 Birds of Mendon in the County of Worcester and State of Massa-  
 chusetts in consideration of three hundred dollars paid by John  
 Burley of said Mendon, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowl-  
 edged, do hereby give, grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the  
 said John Burley his heirs and assigns a certain piece of land  
 situated in said Mendon on the Westerly side of the road leading  
 from Worcester to Providence containing about three acres of land  
 more or less and bounded Beginning at the Westerly side of said  
 road at the Southeast corner of said piece, thirty one and a half  
 feet Southerly of the Southeast corner of school house No. 1 in said  
 Mendon; thence Westerly and bounding Southerly by land of  
 Locus Hill Cemetery (so called) to land of Joseph Albee, thence  
 Northerly and bounding Westerly by said Albee land to the wall,  
 thence Easterly and bounding Northerly by land of said Albee and  
 land now or formerly of Betty Woods to the Westerly side of said  
 road, thence Southerly and bounding Easterly by said road to the  
 place of beginning with all the buildings standing on said piece  
 of land.

To have and to hold the  
 granted premises, with all the privileges and appurtenances  
 thereto belonging to the said John Burley and his heirs and  
 assigns to their own use and behoof forever. And I do hereby  
 for myself and my heirs, executors and administrators covenant  
 with the said grantee and his heirs and assigns that I am law-  
 fully seized in fee simple of the granted premises that they are  
 free from all incumbrances, that I have good right to sell and  
 convey the same as aforesaid, and that I will and my heirs, ex-  
 cutors and administrators shall warrant and defend the same  
 to the said grantee and his heirs and assigns forever against  
 the lawful claims and demands of all persons.

In witness whereof I the said Thomas  
 Birds (unmarried) herunto set my hand and seal this  
 twenty fourth day of January in the year one thousand  
 eight hundred and seventy six.
