 ation of Fifty Dollars (\$50.) paid by Charles B. Goss of All-
 don, Worcester County, Massachusetts, the receipt whereof is here-
 by acknowledged, do hereby remise, release and forever quitclaim
 unto the said Charles B. Goss, all my right, title and interest
 and especially my right of dower in and to the following
 described premises, namely: A certain tract of land with build-
 ings thereon standing containing twenty-three acres more or less,
 situated in the Northerly part of said Allendor, on the Westerly
 side of North Main street, bounded and described as follows,
 to wit: Beginning at the Southeast corner thereof on said
 street at land of James Quigley, and thence running Westerly
 on the line of a stone wall, and bounding land of said Quig-
 ley, to a corner at land of Luther E. Taft; thence Northerly on a
 line with land of Luther E. & Edward H. Taft to a corner at a
 stone wall; thence Easterly on the line of a stone wall and
 bounding land of Luther E. Taft to North Main street; thence
 Southerly on said street to the point of beginning. It being for-
 merly the homestead of Liberty Goss, my husband, now deceased,
 and the premises conveyed by him to said Charles B. Goss, by
 quitclaim deed dated October 16th 1888, recorded with Worcester
 District Deeds, libro 1299 folio 601.

To have and
 to hold the above released premises, with all the privileges and ap-
 pertenances to the same belonging, to the said Charles B. Goss,
her heirs and assigns, to his and their use and behoof forever.
