Know all men by these presents that I, Ann Quigley of Mendon in the County of Worcester and Commonwealth of Massachusetts, in consideration of One Dollar and other valuable considerations paid by James Quigley of said Mendon, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, do hereby remise, release and forever quitclaim unto the said James Quigley one undivided half of two certain tracts or parcels of land situated in said Mendon, the first parcel being in Mendon Center Village on the road leading from Milford to Uxbridge having buildings thereon and being the premises described in deed of said James Quigley to Ellen Quigley dated March 31<sup>st</sup> A.D. 1862 and recorded with Worcester District Deeds Book 649 Page 450, to which deed reference may be had for a more complete description of the premises. The second parcel has buildings thereon is situated in the Northerly part of said Mendon on the Westerly side of the road leading from Providence to Worcester, also known as North Avenue, adjoins land of Grantee and comprises all the premises conveyed by Betsey Wood to Timothy F. Quigley by deed dated November 1<sup>st</sup> A.D. 1888, and recorded with said Deeds Book 1286 Page 5, to which deed reference may be had for a description of the premises.
