

of Dolphus Daniels' land; thence Easterly, bounding on s<sup>d</sup> Dolphus Daniels' land to Nathan Daniels' land; thence Southerly, and bounding Easterly on s<sup>d</sup> Nathan Daniels' land till it comes to the road leading from Mendon to Uxbridge, crossing s<sup>d</sup> road and running Easterly with s<sup>d</sup> road to a three pronged apple tree, being a corner of Nathan Daniels' land; thence Southerly and bounding on s<sup>d</sup> Nathan Daniels' land to a heap of stones; thence Easterly crossing the meadow, to s<sup>d</sup> Rawson's land; thence bounding on s<sup>d</sup> Rawson's land till it comes to David Leggs' land; thence bounding on s<sup>d</sup> David Leggs' land with a various line till it comes to the above said Nathan Daniels' land; and bounding on said Nathan Daniels' land till it comes to William Aldrich's land; thence bounding on said Aldrich's land till it comes to Joseph Bapsett's land; thence bounding on s<sup>d</sup> Bapsett's land till it comes to the road aforesaid; thence Easterly by said road, about twenty rods; thence crossing s<sup>d</sup> road and running Northwesterly by land now in possession of Dolphus Daniels, to the first mentioned bound.

Also another tract of land lying at the Northwesterly corner of the above, containing by estimation about sixteen acres and one half, being a tract of land purchased of Joseph Clark.
