I know all men by these presents, that I Rufus Brewer of Birmingham in the County of Middlesex and Commonwealth of Massachusetts, Yeoman—In consideration of twelve hundred and seventy five dollars paid by Profson Parker of Southborough in the County of Worcester and Commonwealth of said Goodwainor, the receipt whereof I do hereby do hereby, give, grant, sell, and convey unto the said Profson Parker a tract of land and the buildings thereon, situated in said Southborough, containing twenty three acres more or less, and bounded as follows to wit, beginning at the Northeast corner of the lot at the road leading over oak hill; by land of Sullivan Fay and running thence westerly by said Fay's land twenty six rods and eleven links to a corner of the wall; thence Southerly and westerly by land of Dexter Fay about thirty seven rods to the corner of the wall, thence Southerly and Southeasterly by said Dexter Fay's land about twenty four rods to the corner of the wall, thence easterly by said Dexter Fay's land to the corner of the wall and land of Stephen Newton, thence Northerly and Easterly by several angles & turns by land of the said Stephen Newton about eighty four rods to oak hill road thence by said road to the bounds first mentioned—Also one other piece of land in said Southborough containing ten acres more or less and bounded easterly on the road leading to Trinchas Newton's house Southerly & easterly on land of Dexter Fay and northerly on the mill road so called—Also one other piece of meadow land in said Southborough containing two and a half acres more or less bounded northerly by land of Dexter Fay, westerly by land of the widow Deborah Oldman, Southerly by land of Stephen Newton, and easterly by land of Meadon Lydia White—Also about two acres of Cedar Swamp situated in Westborough in the said County of Worcester and bounded Northerly on land of John W. Beeman, Easterly by land of Stephen Newton & Southerly by land of Stephen Newton and Southerly by land of Jason Chamberlain—So have and to hold the aforegranted premises to the said Profson Parker and his heirs and assigns to his and their use and behoof forever and I do covenant with the said Profson Parker and his heirs and assigns that I am lawfully seized in fee of the aforegranted premises that they are free of all incumbrances, that I have good right to sell and convey the same to the said Profson Parker in manner and form as aforesaid and that I will warrant and defend the same premises to the said Profson Parker and his heirs and assigns forever against the lawful claims and demands of all persons, except for two fire frames claimed by Sincobu Newton &c, In witness whereof I the said Rufus Brewer and Mary Brewer the wife of the said Rufus, releasing all her right of dower in said premises have hereunto set our hands and seals this twenty third day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty eight—
