Taft of New York in the State of New York in consideration of five hundred and fifty dollars paid by Ebenezer Taft of said Mendon the receipt whereof is hereby acknowl- edged do hereby sell remise release and forever quit claim unto the said Ebenezer Taft his heirs and assigns a certain tract of land situated in the Westerly part of said Mendon and being a part of the homestead farm of Leonard Taft late of said Mendon deceased and containing twenty acres be the same more or less and bounded as follows to wit. Beginning at the North East corner of the premises a corner of Edward H. Tafts and Martha A. Thayers land thence Westerly and bounded Northerly on the road leading from Mendon to Northbridge fifty nine rods and thirteen links to said Putmans land thence S. 23° 25' W. thirty four rods to stake thence S. 13° 26' E. nine rods twenty four links to end of wall thence S. 37° 6' forty four rods to stones in ditch corner of Henry O. Steward's land the three last lines being on said Putmans land thence N. 76° 1/4 E. sixteen and one half rods to corner of wall thence S. 62° 3' W. five rods and six links thence S. 30° 3' E. eight
