

third tract situated in said Mendon on the other side of the Bellingham road, bounded and described as follows, viz: Beginning at a point on the southeasterly side of said Milford road at land of Gilbert Cook: thence easterly by said road and said Bellingham road to land of H. C. Wilcox: thence by land of H. C. Wilcox and Muddy Brook to land of the heirs of Robert Allen: thence southeasterly by said last named land to land of Orial Cook: thence westerly by said last named land to a stone set in the ground at corner of land belonging to the heirs of Olney Cook: thence northwesterly by last named land of Orial Cook and Gilbert Cook to the point of departure, containing $50^{\circ} 83''$, and such proceedings were had on the petition aforesaid, that at a term of said Superior Court holden at Fitchburg aforesaid, on the second Monday of November 1883, it was adjudged and determined by said Court that partition of the premises should be made as prayed for, and thereupon the said Court did appoint you the said Andrew J. Sumner, James E. Walker and Julius A. George, Commissioners, to make partition accordingly, under a warrant from said Court, agreeably to law. This is therefore, to authorize and empower you, after being duly sworn, and after having given due notice to all persons interested, to make partition of the premises aforesaid so far as it relates to said petitioners, Samuel W. Wilcox and Hamilton C. Wilcox by setting off to them each their one fourth part of said premises, by proper metes and bounds, to have and to hold to them and their heirs and assigns forever in severalty, accordingly.

Which having done, you are to make return of this warrant, with your doings thereon, to the next Superior Court, which shall be holden within and for said County of Worcester, after you shall have performed the said service, to the end the same may be accepted and recorded as the law directs.
