By virtue of this warrant, after being duly sworn as above certified, and having given due notice of the time and place appointed for making the partition, to all persons interested therein, who are known and within the State, we met upon said premises, on the sixth day of December, A.D. 1883, and proceeded to make partition thereof, as follows to wit:

First, we set off to Samuel W. Wilcox about three fourths of an acre of land with the house where he now resides thereon, on the westerly side of the road leading from Milford to Woonsocket, in the easterly part of Mendon bounded, beginning at the northeast corner of the lot at the said road at land of the heirs of Olney Cook: thence Southerly by said road eight rods seventeen and one half links to a mark on the fence at land of Helen M. Barrows and Alice J. Hall: thence westerly by said Barrows and Hall land ten rods and sixteen links to a stake at the end of a wall, at land of said heirs: thence northerly and easterly as the fence and wall now stand by said heirs land to the place of beginning. Also a certain other piece of land situated in said Mendon, bounded as follows, viz: Beginning at the junction of the road leading to Bellingham with said Woonsocket road near the house of the late Samuel G. Wilcox: thence running northeasterly by said Milford and Woonsocket road to land of S. W. Wilcox: thence southeasterly fifty five feet: thence northeasterly eighty five feet to a stake: thence northwesterly back to said road the last three lines bounding on S. W. Wilcox's other land: thence northeasterly again by said road to land of Mary T. Gould: thence easterly a varying line across Mill river by said Gould's land to a fence at land of said Barrows and Hall which separates the plain pasture from the meadow: thence southerly by said Barrows and Hall's land as the fence now stands to said Bellingham road: thence westerly by said road to the east bank of a trench or canal which takes the
